# COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## PASTORAL CRISIS INTERVENTION

Combining faith-based resources with traditional crisis intervention techniques, this course represents a powerful addition to traditional community and organizational psychological support resources. The purpose of this two-day workshop is to assist the participants in learning how pastoral interventions and traditional psychological crisis interventions may be effectively integrated. Chaplains, pastoral counselors, mental health professionals, ministers, and anyone interested in the use of faith-based resources in healing should find this course of interest. (13 contact hours; 1.3 General CEUs from UMBC) Instructor: Chaplain Gary Evans, B.C.E.T.S.; CTS

## BASIC GROUP INTERVENTION

Basic Group Intervention presents the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum. This course prepares participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services including pre and post incident crisis education, significant other support services, on-scene support services, crisis intervention for individuals, demobilizations after large scale traumatic incidents, small group defusing and Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD). The Basic Group Intervention course prepares participants to provide several of these interventions. The need for appropriate follow up services and referrals when necessary is also described. At the completion of this course, participants will be able to : Define stress, CIS, and PTSD; List the 10 basic interventions of CISM; and Define and describe in detail the CISM group processes of Demobilizations, Defusings, and Debriefings. (14 Contact Hours; 14 CE Credits for Psychologists; 14 PDHs for EAPs; 14 CE Hours for Calif. MFTs & LCSWs; 16.8 Nursing Hours; OR 1.4 general CEUs from UMBC)\* Completion of The CISM: Group Crisis Intervention class and receipt of a certificate indicating full attendance (14 Contact Hours) qualifies as a CORE class in ICISF's Certificate of Specialized Training Program. Instructor: Dr. Durrell Tuberville. **This course is a prerequisite for the Advanced Group Intervention course.**

## ASSISTING INDIVIDUALS IN CRISIS

This is the newly revised course formerly titled Individual Intervention and Peer Support. As physical first-aid is to surgery, crisis intervention is to psychotherapy. Thus, crisis intervention is sometimes called "emotional first-aid." Crisis interventions are typically done individually (one-on-one) or in groups. This program is designed to teach participants the fundamentals of, and a specific protocol for, individual intervention. The audience for this class includes both emergency services, military, and business/industrial peer support personnel without formal training in mental health, as well as mental health professionals, who desire to increase their knowledge of individual (one-on-one) crisis intervention techniques. (13 Contact Hours = 1.3 CEUs) Instructor: Chaplain Ron Richardson, B.C.E.T.S.

## ADVANCED GROUP INTERVENTION

This course is designed to provide participants with the latest information on critical incident stress management techniques and post-trauma syndromes. The program emphasizes a broadening of the knowledge base concerning critical incident stress interventions as well as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder which was established in the basic program and/or in publications. Participants will be exposed to specific, proven strategies to intervene with those suffering the ill effects of their exposure to trauma. The emphasis will be on advanced defusings and debriefings in complex situations. The Advanced Group Intervention training has been developed for EAP, human resources and public safety personnel, mental health professionals, chaplains, paramedics, firefighters, physicians, police officers, nurses, dispatchers, airline personnel and disaster workers who are already trained in the critical incident stress debriefing format. It will also be useful for those who are working extensively with traumatized victims from various walks of life. (13 Contact Hours = 1.3 CEUs) Instructor: Dr. Durrell Tuberville.

# WORKSHOP PRESENTERS

### Chaplain Gary Evans

Chaplain Evans provides chaplain services for several police, fire, and EMS agencies in South Jersey. The NJ State Police, Department of Homeland Security certified him as a Community Emergency Response Team Trainer and Program Manager. Following the 9-11 attacks he was called to join the American Airlines Crisis Management Team at JFK International Airport to provide crisis interventions for pilots and flight crews. He deployed to Louisiana and Mississippi to provide CISM services post Katrina for the Pastors' Resource Council.

### Dr. Denny Nissley

Dr. Denny Nissley is the President of Christ in Action Ministries in Manassas, VA. His was the official food service site at the Pentagon post 9-11. They served at Ground Zero in New York City and provided distribution sites in Gulfport, Mississippi and the New Orleans area post Katrina. FEMA sent people to Dr. Nissley to be trained to run distribution sites. Dr. Nissley has also been asked to serve on the Disaster Relief Advisory Board for the State of Virginia.

### Chaplain Ron Richardson

Chaplain Richardson is President of Chaplain Services International. He provides training throughout California for Law Enforcement Chaplaincy and public school chaplaincy. He also provides chaplain and crisis intervention service for a national corporation with over 1,100 locations in the U.S., Mexico, and Puerto Rico with one assistant, six regional service providers, and over 50 chaplains throughout the United States.

### Dr. Durrell Tuberville

Dr. Durrell Tuberville serves on the pastoral staff at First Assembly of God, Shreveport, LA. He also serves on the Governors Task Force for Disasters under the Department of Health and Hospitals and was responsible for organizing and deploying all the CISM teams that worked with First Responders after Hurricane Katrina. Some of our NCN district Chaplains served under Dr. Tuberville's leadership post Katrina.

### Chaplain Jim Uhey

Chaplain Uhey is Senior Associate Pastor at Family Life Christian Center in San Jose, CA. He also serves as a Community Chaplain with the San Jose Police Department. Chaplain Uhey's crisis response experience includes responding to the Oklahoma City bombing, Ground Zero in New York City, the Madrid, Spain subway bombing, ministry in Sri Lanka following the tsunami, and ministry in the gulf states following hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Jim also facilitated NCN response teams and is Chairman of the NCN district Disaster Response Program.

### Other Special Guests

We anticipate the participation of other guests who have served in various crisis situations who will share their experiences in various sessions.
